A reading from the second book of Moses called Exodus

Exodus 32.7-14

The Lord said to Moses, 'Go down at once! Your people, whom you brought up out of the land of Egypt, have acted perversely; they have been quick to turn aside from the way that I commanded them; they have cast for themselves an image of a calf, and have worshipped it and sacrificed to it, and said, "These are your gods, O Israel, who brought you up out of the land of Egypt!" ' The Lord said to Moses, 'I have seen this people, how stiff-necked they are. Now let me alone, so that my wrath may burn hot against them and I may consume them; and of you I will make a great nation.' But Moses implored the Lord his God, and said, 'O Lord, why does your wrath burn hot against your people, whom you brought out of the land of Egypt with great power and with a mighty hand? Why should the Egyptians say, "It was with evil intent that he brought them out to kill them in the mountains, and to consume them from the face of the earth"? Turn from your fierce wrath; change your mind and do not bring disaster on your people. Remember Abraham,

A reading from the first letter of Paul to Timothy

1 Timothy 1.1-2, 12-19a

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the command of God our Saviour and of Christ Jesus our hope, To Timothy, my loyal child in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord. I am grateful to Christ Jesus our Lord, who has strengthened me, because he judged me faithful and appointed me to his service, even though I was formerly a blasphemer, a persecutor, and a man of violence. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners—of whom I am the foremost. But for that very reason I received mercy, so that in me, as the foremost, Jesus Christ might display the utmost patience, making me an example to those who would come to believe in him for eternal life. TURTON, William Henry ('Harry'). b. Peshawar, India, 30 December 1856; d. Okehampton, Devon, 16 June 1938. He was the son of an army officer, and was educated at Clifton College, Bristol, and the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich. He was commissioned into the Royal Engineers, rising to the rank of Lieutenant-Colonel. He was decorated for bravery on several occasions during the South African War (1899-1902). He retired from the army in 1905, and devoted himself to the study of genealogy and natural history. Turton published A Few Hymns written by a Layman between the Festivals of All Saints, 1880 and 1881 (ca. 1881).

O Thou who at Thy Eucharist didst pray. William Henry ('Harry') Turton* (1856-1938). First published in Turton's A Few Hymns written by a Layman between the Festivals of All Saints, 1880 and 1881, a collection of twelve hymns, followed by two further collections in the two following years. This hymn comes from the first Few Hymns, where it was entitled 'For Unity', with a note 'Used at S. Mary Magdalene's, Munster Square, N.W., in the Anniversary Service of the English Church Union, June 22 1881'.

Arranged from the melody and bass of Orlando Gibbons (baptised 25 December 1583 – 5 June 1625) He was an English composer, virginalist and organist of the late Tudor and early Jacobean periods. He was a leading composer in the England of his day. Hymn 443 was attributed to Ralph Vaughan Williams.. The English composer Ralph Vaughan Williams (1872-1958) was a proponent of nationalism in music and was active in reviving the English folk song. The son of a clergyman, Ralph Vaughan Williams was born at Down Ampney in Gloucestershire on Oct. 12, 1872.
