LOCUM'S LETTER

In today's Old Testament reading from Jeremiah, often described as the reluctant prophet, is the promise to rebuild Israel after the aftermath of the Babylonian conquest and decimation. The promise includes rebuilding, in gathering exiles, abundant harvest and restoration of the temple and its sacrifices. This restoration is called the redemption of Israel and it is not personal but nationwide. The covenant we heard about this morning is to be engraved on the hearts of God's people. This does not mean that faith will not have to be thought about or studied but rather he is speaking about people who have lost everything, who are restored and therefore know God through their own experiences.

Trustworthiness and the power of God to redeem and make whole is what the Gospel evangelists saw in the message of Jesus. For them it is contagious and seen in the life and ministry of Jesus.

In today's Gospel a tension is present for the reader. Jesus announces his hour has come. Jesus' life is moving fast towards the final days and we the reader wait for the coming of the hour. Jesus recognises and wrestles with the stark reality before him. This is no reality TV show but real life.

We often make the mistake that it is only Jesus that can save the world forgetting that we also have a part to play in shaping, influencing and living our lives as he lived, life giving and hospitable to all.

Jeremiah 31.31-34

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the Lord', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

A Reading from the book of Hebrews Hebrews 5.5-14

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

- 'You are my Son, today I have begotten you'; as he says also in another place,
- 'You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek.'

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission.

Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

About this we have much to say that is hard to explain, since you have become dull in understanding.

For though by this time you ought to be teachers, you need someone to teach you again the basic elements of the oracles of God. You need milk, not solid food; for everyone who lives on milk, being still an infant, is unskilled in the word of righteousness. But solid food is for the mature, for those whose faculties have been trained by practice to distinguish good from evil. For the Word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God**

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ

Now among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, 'Sir, we wish to see Jesus.' Philip went and told Andrew; then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, 'The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Those who love their life lose it, and those who hate their life in this world will keep it for eternal life. Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour. 'Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say—"Father, save me from this hour"? No, it is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name.' Then a voice came from heaven, 'I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again.' The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, 'An angel has spoken to him.' Jesus answered, 'This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgement of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself.' He said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.
