Locum Letter April 22nd 2018

The fourth Sunday in the Easter season is known as Good Shepherd Sunday. In the time of Jesus people did not think too highly of shepherds. They sometimes allowed their sheep to graze on other people's land, sometimes they left town without paying their bills, they often lived lonely and isolated lives and seemed to lack what we would call appropriate social graces.

This view stands in stark contrast to today's Gospel where John reminds us that Jesus is the Good Shepherd. In the imagery of the shepherd John portrays in the Gospel for today the shepherd is the one who,

- Leads the sheep
- Provides food for them
- Finds them safe lodgings.
- Searches for them when they are lost
- Tends their wounds for them when they are hurt
- Protects them from wild animals.

In ancient times the term shepherd was often used to describe those who ruled over nations-the kings, queens, princes and those who ruled over nations.

Jesus called himself the Good Shepherd because he gladly and purposively identified with the shepherds humble and poor image. He identified himself

with those outside polite and acceptable company. But he did not limit himself to those who were rejected. He also identified himself as the Good Shepherd for all men and women irrespective of their social standing and wealth.

Today's Gospel is a call and reminder to all of us who exercise leadership, whether in church, business or community of the immense privilege and responsibility given to us and to be mindful of the way we care for all of God's people. We all have leadership responsibilities and the task is to set a good example of this privilege.

The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord.
