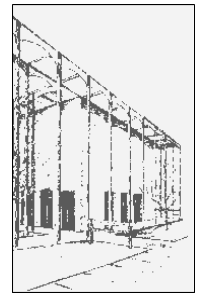
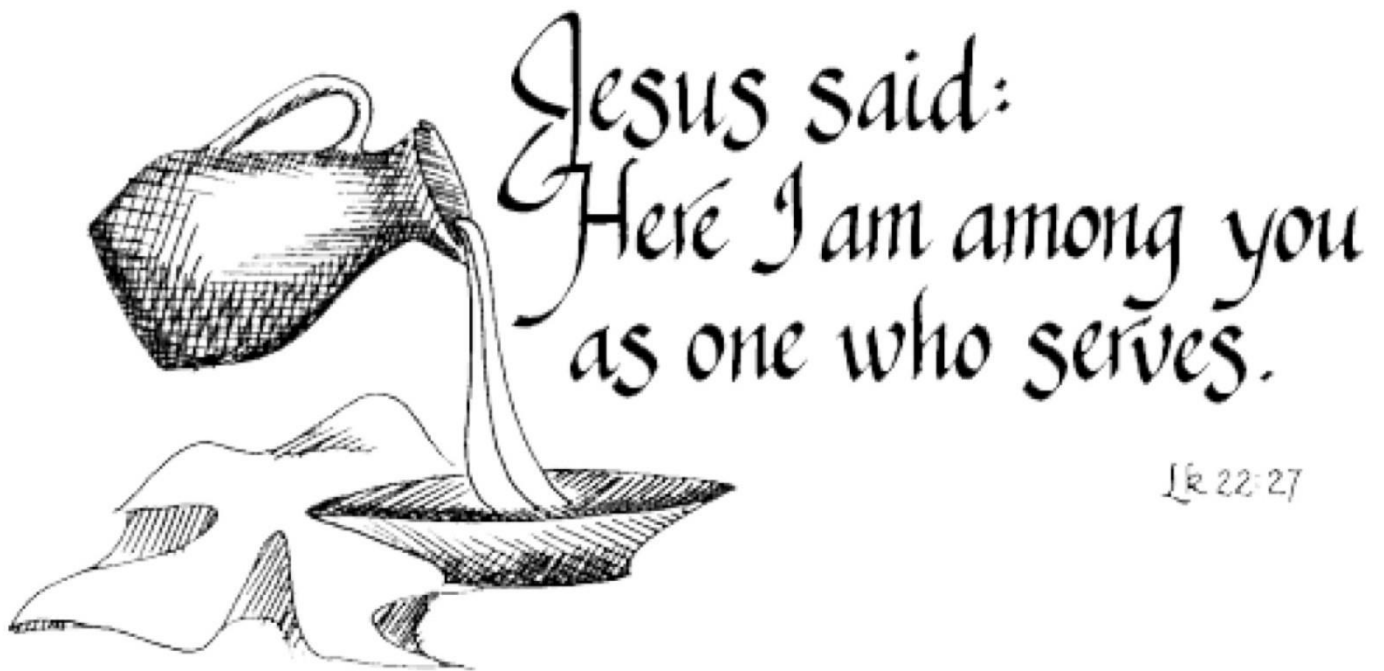

From our Locum,

As most of you are aware I spent time away from the parish earlier in the month on Retreat. The noun 'retreat' means a place you can go to be alone, to get away from it all for the purpose of reconnecting, usually in prayer, with God. (Not the retreat in battle when the troops are losing and need to withdraw!) I spent the week at Pallotti College at Millgrove, near Warburton.

A number of people have said to me over the years that "I couldn't stand all that silence." My retreat this time was not a silent retreat although I did spend a lot of time being quiet, both physically and mentally. My mind often goes at 100kms an hour and so this retreat I spent some time just sitting and paying attention to the natural world around me and hearing the various birdcalls in the bush and enjoying the sights and sounds of the forest.

A retreat is a time for rest and I did quite a lot of that – there is something about sleeping and allowing the body to slow down. I also walked and talked slowly and tried not to rush particularly as I ate my meals.

A retreat is also a time for reading. Usually I take more books to read than is necessary and apart from what one might call spiritual reading, I took a couple of novels and just before bed read stories of bush priests from different parts of Australia – some of them were very funny and I would often go to sleep easily after a good laugh.

A retreat is also a time of remembering – I would often write things down that came to me whether remembering about passages of Scripture or people

whom I knew needed some prayer whilst using the daily Office. I was very lucky to have in the Retreat House members of the Diocese of Gippsland and their new Bishop, Bishop Richard Treloar, who I knew from my days as Hospital Chaplain at The Alfred – it was great to share the Eucharist with them.

I had a wonder filled retreat and I would recommend the experience to anyone who wants to spend time with themselves, God and the wonders of creation.

Or who stretched the line upon it?

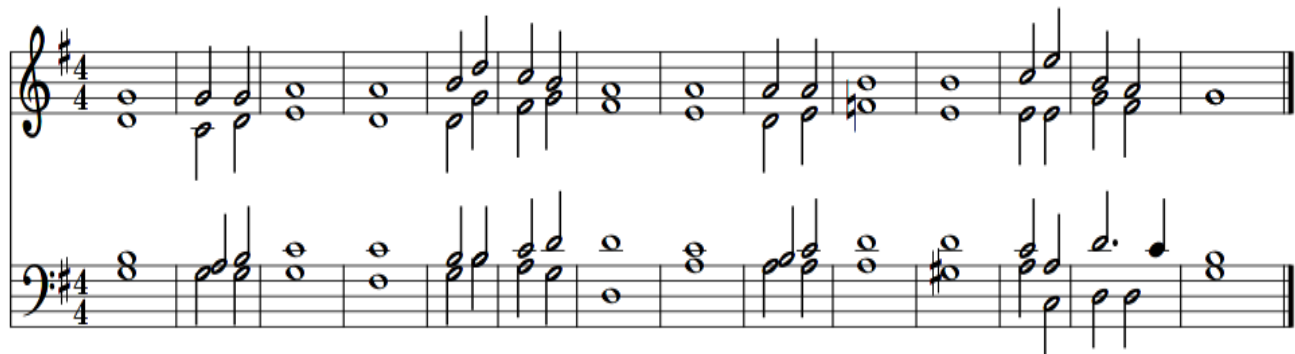

A reading from Hebrews

Hebrews 5.1-10

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins.

He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness;

and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people.

And one does not presume to take this honour, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him,

‘You are my Son, today I have begotten you’;

as he says also in another place,

‘You are a priest for ever, according to the order of Melchizedek.’

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission.

Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him, having been designated by God a high priest according to the order of Melchizedek.

Mark 10.35-45

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ
