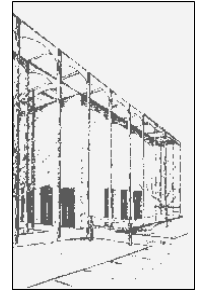

From our Locum,

Today we are celebrating All Saints Day. There is no Greek word for saint and so when Paul wrote in his many epistles "to the saints at..." a proper translation should be "to the 'holy ones' at...". In the New Testament, "saint" did not denote the deceased who had been recognised as especially holy, but rather the living faithful who had dedicated themselves to God. A saint is therefore a person who strives to be holy in life and seek after God. This means that it is not just the destination which the saint is looking forward to – it is rather a journey which seeks to follow the path wherever God leads.

The other festival which is associated with All Saints is All Souls Day. This is usually the day after but this year the parish will remember All Souls Day on Wednesday 7<sup>th</sup> November at the 10am Eucharist. On this day we remember our loved ones who have died. At the back of the Church there is a pen and paper for you to write the names down so that prayers of remembrance, gratefulness and thanksgiving can be made at that service.

There are also some 2019 Lectionaries available for you to use in your daily prayers and bible readings. In the Anglican Church calendar we commence Readings for Year C beginning at Advent which starts on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> December.

I do hope that you will remember Fr John and his family as they pack up to make the move to Melbourne in the next few weeks. Moving can be a stressful time for any family and we should pray that their move will go smoothly and without problems.

Following the move they will be taking holidays before the Induction Service which is on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> December.

**Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ**

When Mary came where Jesus was and saw him, she knelt at his feet and said to him, ‘Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.’ When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who came with her also weeping, he was greatly disturbed in spirit and deeply moved. He said, ‘Where have you laid him?’ They said to him, ‘Lord, come and see.’ Jesus began to weep. So, the Jews said, ‘See how he loved him!’ But some of them said, ‘Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?’ Then Jesus, again greatly disturbed, came to the tomb. It was a cave, and a stone was lying against it. Jesus said, ‘Take away the stone.’ Martha, the sister of the dead man, said to him, ‘Lord, already there is a stench because he has been dead
