O God, you have prepared for those who love you joys beyond our understanding: pour into our hearts such love for you, that, loving you above all else, we may obtain your promises that exceed all we can desire; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. **Amen.** 

### **FIRST READING**

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Then Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, 'Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, "To an unknown god." What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For "In him we live and move and have our being"; as even some of your own poets have said,"For we too are his offspring." Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.'

## SECOND READING

A reading from the first letter of Peter

Finally, all of you, have unity of spirit, sympathy, love for one another, a tender heart, and a humble mind. Do not repay evil for evil or abuse for abuse; but, on the contrary, repay with a blessing. It is for this that you were called—that you might inherit a blessing. For 'Those who desire life and desire to see good days, let them keep their tongues from evil and their lips from speaking deceit; let them turn away from evil and do good; let them seek peace and pursue it. For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, and his ears are open to their prayer. But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil.' Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defence to anyone who demands from you an account of the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight people, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body,



but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.


## GOSPEL

### Parish Council – Restore & refurbish the church floor

Parish Council met via Zoom on Sunday 10 Mat 2020 and resolved to restore and refurbish the floor of the church. This involves the removal of the pews, repairing of the floor (filling holes and replacing a broken board), sealing the organ to protect the pipes and mechanism from dust and dirt, sanding and polishing the floorboards, returning the pews to their correct positions and then cleaning the carpets. Thank you to Barry for overseeing this project and to Vince and Beth for appreciated advice and assistance.

#### Improvements to Sound System

In the week commencing Monday 18 May 2020 we hope to install new wireless microphones, CD player and technology to enable Bluetooth enabled devices to play through our system. This will improve the quality of the sound, provide an increased broadcast capability and deliver a system that is compliant with Federal legislation.

## GOOD NEWS - PUBLIC WORSHIP OUT OF RECESS

The Commonwealth Government recently announced a 'Roadmap to a COVIDSafe Australia' and a '3 Step Framework For A Covidsafe Australia,' which is to be implemented in accordance with the State Government's Restricted Activity Directions (No 7), which we (the parish) implement in accordance with the Archbishop's Diocesan Covid-19 Update of 13 May 2020.

What does that all mean? We can resume public worship, subject to the provision of the documents above, which means no more than 10 parishioners, plus clergy and those required to operate the service, as long as we maintain social distancing. There are also some other requirements around cleaning and recording of attendance which I have in hand.

The important point to note is that subject to the refurbishment of the church floor being completed we can return to church on Sunday 24 May 2020, the Seventh Sunday of Easter with the following services:

7.30am Morning Prayer

8am Holy Communion

10am Holy Communion live streamed via Facebook.

We will resume our midweek 10am Wednesday Holy Communion on 27 May 2020.

If you would like to attend any of these services please contact me by telephone or text. There is no pressure on you to physically return to church if you do not believe it is appropriate for you to do so. Please join us online for a live streamed service.

This is exciting news and an important step for us all, but please note that all is subject to change as we prepare the church to welcome people back.
